An Act To Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue To Invest in Railroads To Reduce the Cost of Shipping to Maine Businesses, Attract Tourists to Maine and Facilitate the Development of Commuter Rail Transportation To Reduce the Use of Oil in Maine

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Preamble. Two thirds of both Houses of the Legislature deeming it necessary in accordance with the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 14 to authorize the issuance of bonds on behalf of the State of Maine to provide funds as described in this Act,

5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

6 Sec. 1. Authorization of bonds. The Treasurer of State is authorized, under the 7 direction of the Governor, to issue bonds in the name and on behalf of the State in an 8 amount not exceeding \$25,000,000 for the purposes described in section 5 of this Act. 9 The bonds are a pledge of the full faith and credit of the State. The bonds may not run for 10 a period longer than 10 years from the date of the original issue of the bonds.

11 **Sec. 2. Records of bonds issued; Treasurer of State.** The Treasurer of State 12 shall ensure that an account of each bond is kept showing the number of the bond, the 13 name of the successful bidder to whom sold, the amount received for the bond, the date of 14 sale and the date when payable.

15 Sec. 3. Sale; how negotiated; proceeds appropriated. The Treasurer of State may negotiate the sale of the bonds by direction of the Governor, but no bond may be 16 loaned, pledged or hypothecated on behalf of the State. The proceeds of the sale of the 17 bonds, which must be held by the Treasurer of State and paid by the Treasurer of State 18 19 upon warrants drawn by the State Controller, are appropriated solely for the purposes set forth in this Act. Any unencumbered balances remaining at the completion of the project 20 21 in this Act lapse to the Office of the Treasurer of State to be used for the retirement of 22 general obligation bonds.

Sec. 4. Interest and debt retirement. The Treasurer of State shall pay interest
 due or accruing on any bonds issued under this Act and all sums coming due for payment
 of bonds at maturity.

Sec. 5. Disbursement of bond proceeds; allocations from General Fund bond issue. The proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized under this Act must be expended as designated in the following schedule under the direction and supervision of the agencies and entities set forth in this section.

- Sec. 6. Consultation with business and economic development sector. The
 Department of Transportation shall consult with the business and economic development

sector to develop a list of priorities in regard to railroad construction and reconstruction projects. To determine priorities of commuter and passenger railroad projects, the Department shall consult with organizations representing the public, including tourism associations and citizens groups, focusing on projects important to tourism and projects with greatest visibility for increased commuter and passenger rail service and taking into consideration the extent that proposed projects reduce the consumption of oil.

Sec. 7. Contingent upon ratification of bond issue. Sections 1 to 5 do not
 become effective unless the people of the State ratify the issuance of the bonds as set
 forth in this Act.

10 Sec. 8. Appropriation balances at year-end. At the end of each fiscal year, all 11 unencumbered appropriation balances representing state money carry forward. Bond 12 proceeds that have not been expended within 10 years after the date of the sale of the 13 bonds lapse to the Office of the Treasurer of State to be used for the retirement of general 14 obligation bonds.

15 Sec. 9. Bonds authorized but not issued. Any bonds authorized but not issued 16 within 5 years of ratification of this Act are deauthorized and may not be issued, except 17 that the Legislature may, within 2 years after the expiration of that 5-year period, extend 18 the period for issuing any remaining unissued bonds for an additional amount of time not 19 to exceed 5 years.

20 Sec. 10. Referendum for ratification; submission at election; form of 21 question; effective date. This Act must be submitted to the legal voters of the State at 22 a statewide election held in the month of November following passage of this Act. The 23 municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns 24 and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, 25 to vote on the acceptance or rejection of this Act by voting on the following question:

"Do you favor a \$25,000,000 bond issue to provide funds for railroad
reconstruction and expansion that the business sector considers vital to
the shipment of goods and the ability of the business community to
compete?"

30 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square 31 below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and 32 declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of 33 34 State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall 35 review the returns. If a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of this Act, the Governor shall proclaim the result without delay and this Act becomes effective 30 days 36 after the date of the proclamation. 37

The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all
 ballots, returns and copies of this Act necessary to carry out the purposes of this
 referendum.

SUMMARY

2 The funds provided by this bond issue, in the amount of \$25,000,000, will be used to provide funds for railroad reconstruction and expansion that the business sector considers 3 4 vital to the shipment of goods and the ability of the business community to compete. It 5 requires that the Department of Transportation consult with the business and economic 6 development sector to develop a list of priorities in regard to railroad construction and 7 reconstruction projects focusing on projects important to tourism and projects with 8 greatest visibility for increased commuter and passenger rail service and taking into 9 consideration the extent that proposed projects reduce the consumption of oil.

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
