Resolve, To Restore the MaineCare Nursing Facility COVID-19 Temporary Rate Increase

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, temporary reimbursement increases to nursing facilities were in effect from March 1, 2020 to May 31, 2020 in response to the effects of COVID-19 on nursing facilities; and

Whereas, rate increases to nursing facilities have ended although COVID-19 community transmission rates have continued to increase significantly; and

Whereas, nursing facilities provide care for the most vulnerable and elderly Maine residents and need to be supported in that endeavor; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Department of Health and Human Services to increase nursing facility rates of reimbursement. Resolved: That the Department of Health and Human Services shall amend its rules to increase reimbursement rates in rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter III, Section 67, Principles of Reimbursement for Nursing Facilities, to rates that are no less than the rates that were in effect on May 31, 2020. The department shall implement the same accountability and transparency requirements, requirements regarding the appropriate use of funds, bonus payments for job performance and cost settlement requirements that applied to the use of temporary rate increases that were in effect from March 1, 2020 to May 31, 2020. The increased rates must remain in effect at least until the state of emergency due to coronavirus disease 2019, also known as COVID-19, has ended as declared by the Governor.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this legislation takes effect when approved.

27 SUMMARY

This resolve requires the Department of Health and Human Services to amend its rule Chapter 101: MaineCare Benefits Manual, Chapter III, Section 67, Principles of Reimbursement for Nursing Facilities, to increase reimbursement rates to rates that are no less than the rates that were in effect on May 31, 2020. The increased rates must remain in effect at least until the end of the state of emergency due to COVID-19 as declared by the Governor. Temporary rate increases to nursing facility funding with federal funding were in effect from March 1, 2020 to May 31, 2020.
