An Act To Authorize a General Fund Bond Issue To Assist in the Commercialization of Maine Products and Services

Presented by Senator VOLK of Cumberland. (GOVERNOR'S BILL) Cosponsored by Representative MASTRACCIO of Sanford. **Preamble.** Two thirds of both Houses of the Legislature deeming it necessary in accordance with the Constitution of Maine, Article IX, Section 14 to authorize the issuance of bonds on behalf of the State of Maine to provide funds as described in this Act,

5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

6 Sec. 1. Authorization of bonds. The Treasurer of State is authorized, under the 7 direction of the Governor, to issue bonds in the name and on behalf of the State in an 8 amount not exceeding \$50,000,000 for the purposes described in section 5 of this Act. 9 The bonds are a pledge of the full faith and credit of the State. The bonds may not run for 10 a period longer than 10 years from the date of the original issue of the bonds.

11 Sec. 2. Records of bonds issued; Treasurer of State. The Treasurer of State 12 shall ensure that an account of each bond is kept showing the number of the bond, the 13 name of the successful bidder to whom sold, the amount received for the bond, the date of 14 sale and the date when payable.

15 Sec. 3. Sale; how negotiated; proceeds appropriated. The Treasurer of State 16 may negotiate the sale of the bonds by direction of the Governor, but no bond may be loaned, pledged or hypothecated on behalf of the State. The proceeds of the sale of the 17 bonds, which must be held by the Treasurer of State and paid by the Treasurer of State 18 19 upon warrants drawn by the State Controller, are appropriated solely for the purposes set forth in this Act. Any unencumbered balances remaining at the completion of the project 20 in this Act lapse to the Office of the Treasurer of State to be used for the retirement of 21 22 general obligation bonds.

Sec. 4. Interest and debt retirement. The Treasurer of State shall pay interest
 due or accruing on any bonds issued under this Act and all sums coming due for payment
 of bonds at maturity.

26 Sec. 5. Disbursement of bond proceeds from General Fund bond issue. 27 The proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized under this Act must be expended as 28 designated in the following schedule under the direction and supervision of the agencies 29 and entities set forth in this section.

- 30 SMALL ENTERPRISE GROWTH
- 31 FUND 32
- 33 The Chamberlain Fund

Provides funds to the Small Enterprise Growth Board to establish or participate in a new equity capital fund, the Chamberlain Fund. Investments from the fund will be leveraged by private sector capital. The fund will provide patient capital to rapidly growing businesses in the State with strong potential for job growth and return on investment.

- 17 Provides funds to create a new fund, the Baxter Innovation Challenge Fund, administered by the Department of Economic and Community Development in 18 19 consultation with the Maine Technology Institute. The fund will focus on technology 20 sectors with a particular emphasis on identifying and addressing challenges facing traditional industries in the State. Additionally, the fund will leverage at least 21 22 \$30,000,000 in other funds to repurpose and utilize existing infrastructure to facilitate the continued growth of businesses and commercial enterprises that grow the State's 23 economy and create new jobs. 24

Sec. 6. Contingent upon ratification of bond issue. Sections 1 to 5 do not
 become effective unless the people of the State ratify the issuance of the bonds as set
 forth in this Act.

**Sec. 7. Appropriation balances at year-end.** At the end of each fiscal year, all unencumbered appropriation balances representing state money carry forward. Bond proceeds that have not been expended within 10 years after the date of the sale of the bonds lapse to the Office of the Treasurer of State to be used for the retirement of general obligation bonds.

Sec. 8. Bonds authorized but not issued. Any bonds authorized but not issued within 5 years of ratification of this Act are deauthorized and may not be issued, except that the Legislature may, within 2 years after the expiration of that 5-year period, extend the period for issuing any remaining unissued bonds for an additional amount of time not
 to exceed 5 years.

**Sec. 9. Referendum for ratification; submission at election; form of question; effective date.** This Act must be submitted to the legal voters of the State at a statewide election held in June of 2017. The municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, to vote on the acceptance or rejection of this Act by voting on the following question:

9 "Do you favor a \$50,000,000 bond issue to further accelerate growth and
10 capital investment in Maine businesses by leveraging private investment
11 for the purpose of generating new revenue and providing new jobs?"

12 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question and designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square 13 below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and 14 15 declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall 16 review the returns. If a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of this Act, the 17 18 Governor shall proclaim the result without delay and this Act becomes effective 30 days 19 after the date of the proclamation.

- The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this Act necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

- The funds provided by this bond issue, in the amount of \$50,000,000, will be used to further accelerate growth and capital investment in businesses in the State by leveraging private investment for the purpose of generating new revenue and providing new jobs.
