25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32	This amendment clarifies the bill regarding the exemption from certain state overtime pay requirements of executive branch and judicial branch employees engaged in fire protection activities and law enforcement activities by specifying that those employees are not entitled to overtime for working more than 40 hours in any one week only if those employees are eligible to have overtime pay calculated and paid in accordance with the standards set forth under the specified federal law. It also provides that parties are not prohibited from negotiating an agreement that provides for the payment of overtime pay that exceeds federal law.
