13 SUMMARY

This amendment replaces the bill and changes the title. The amendment amends the provision of law authorizing a tax credit for employers of individuals who are volunteer firefighters or volunteer municipal emergency medical services persons to include volunteer municipal firefighters under the tax credit. The amendment also defines "volunteer municipal firefighter" as a part-time or on-call municipal firefighter who receives up to 20% of the compensation of a full-time municipal firefighter and who may receive injury and death benefits.
