The Public Utilities Commission shall solicit stakeholder input on whether and, if so, at what cost and under what conditions, including commission approval on a case-by-case basis, an investor-owned transmission and distribution utility may own, have a financial interest in or otherwise control an energy storage system, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, section 3481, subsection 6, in order to perform its obligations as a transmission and distribution utility in an effective, prudent and efficient manner. In making recommendations, in addition to the input received from stakeholders, the commission shall consider at a minimum:
27 28	1. The role that investor-owned transmission and distribution utility ownership of, financial interest in or control of energy storage systems may have in:

15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25	This amendment removes a provision relating to financial interests owned by investor-owned transmission and distribution utilities and requires the Public Utilities Commission to conduct a study with stakeholder participation to examine whether and, if so, at what cost and under what conditions, including commission approval on a case-by-case basis, an investor-owned transmission and distribution utility may own, have a financial interest in or otherwise control an energy storage system. The amendment requires the commission to consider whether the competitive market for energy storage can meet the needs of transmission and distribution utilities at a reasonable cost. The amendment also changes the commission's reporting date to February 15, 2024 and states that the Joint Standing Committee on Energy, Utilities and Technology may report out a bill related to the subject matter of the report.
