As used in this section, "veterans' facility" means a nursing facility, medical and remedial facility or multilevel health care facility operated by the Maine Veterans' Homes and "multilevel health care facility" has the same meaning as in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 22, section 7852, subsection 10-A.

This amendment replaces the bill and Committee Amendment "A" with a resolve requiring the Department of Health and Human Services to amend its MaineCare rules regarding reimbursement rates for nursing homes and medical and remedial facilities to require that reimbursement be provided to veterans' facilities on a per resident daily rate basis for services to residents covered under the United States Social Security Act, Title XIX at all Maine Veterans' Homes facilities. The per resident daily rate calculation must result in reimbursement of the portion of the total allowable cost of operating each veterans' facility attributable to the provision of services to residents who receive MaineCare benefits. The rules must contain a requirement that the rates are indexed to inflation. The
