LD 206 - An Act To Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations from the General Fund and Other Funds for the Expenditures of State Government, and to Change Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2023

Good afternoon Senators Rotundo and Rafferty, Representatives Sachs and Brennan, and members of the Joint Standing Committees on Appropriations & Financial Affairs and Education & Cultural Affairs.

My name is Lori Fisher, and I am the Maine State Librarian. I'm here to testify in support of LD 206, the Governor's Supplemental Budget proposal for State fiscal year 2023. This testimony addresses two initiatives on **page A – 34** that are specific to the renovations currently underway at the Maine State Cultural Building.

## \$1.5 million for High Density Shelving

Space issues at the Maine State Library have been well documented in architectural studies over the last 20 years. Over the library's 185 years in service to the people of Maine, it has established several permanent collections pertaining to the history and culture of Maine that have steadily grown. As the library prepares to move back to space at the Cultural Building, a new shelving layout is planned for the public area of the library to ensure compliance with the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. § 12101 *et seq.* (1990) in the aisles between shelves. The new layout will also provide additional space for conducting research, group meetings and public events. This funding will purchase high density compact shelving for the first-floor storehouse of the library to relieve current space constraints and accommodate materials that no longer will have room in the public stacks of the library. The basis for this request is documented in a 2019 study commissioned by the Bureau of General Services (Storage Space Requirements Summary - Final; Space Planning for Cultural Building & BABLO Building), which recommended installation of high density mobile shelving on the first floor of the library with the goal of nearly doubling the storage capacity of that space. We are making this request now so that we have enough lead time to procure and install the shelving before the projected construction completion of April 2024.

## \$300K for Space Planning in MSL section of Cultural Building

This request will provide the Maine State Library with the resources necessary to ensure the investment of State funds in the current renovation of the library will make optimal use of public areas and ensure the library meets its mission of public service and service to Maine's public libraries. Creating new models for library service and facility use that align with best practices and adapt to the changing way that the library serves the public supports Title 27 § 36 which requires the Maine State Library to provide advice to all public libraries in the manner in which library operations are carried out. Funding will support a contract with a library space planning firm. This should take place in tandem with the purchase of high-density shelving so that the library is set up for success at the outset of the opening of the newly renovated Cultural Building.
