We witness the good, nutritious food people are buying year round with the SNAP/Maine Harvest Bucks benefits at our farmstand and farmers market. With help from MOFGA, some will use their bonus bucks to participate in our Community Supported Agriculture program. This money spent, you can be certain, is for the better nutrition of those in need or who might not be able to afford farm fresh produce. We develop close relationships with all our customers and know, when they may fall ill, they are doing the best they can by eating well. We praise young parents and kids who shop and buy fresh veggie snacks with their bonus bucks.

We donate about 20,000 pounds a year to local foodbanks and soup kitchens.
