My name is Shirley Hager, I live in Chesterville, Maine, and I am writing to you as a concerned citizen to **urge you to vote "ought to pass" on LD 928.**

The time to act on climate change is now and, to this end, states and municipalities need every possible tool to use in this effort. We can no longer afford half-measures or to feel complacent because we live in a state currently with abundant water or a comparatively livable climate.

Every one of us, if we think we not impacted presently by climate change, soon will be. I just returned from a trip to North Carolina where I spent time helping my brother move away from the Intercoastal Waterway where he has lived for 49 years. Five years ago, his neighborhood was devastated by Hurricane Florence and, as soon as we were allowed, we went down to help him then too. If you have never experienced the aftermath of a hurricane and/or flooding, you cannot imagine the physical, emotional, and economic impact. To see entire neighborhoods with all their household belongings piled eight feet high on their sidewalks and people sitting on their porches with their heads in their hands...it is an image that never leaves you. Every one of us, or our friends and families, will soon be impacted in some way by what is coming if we do not act.

On Monday of this week, the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) issued a report stating that we are already likely to miss the goal of limiting global warming to 2.7 degrees Fahrenheit above preindustrial temperatures. This same report states that we already have the knowledge and the technology to avert this crisis, but governments are not acting quickly enough. Policy falls behind what is possible.
