I support Maine developing a long term plan to increase investments in child care programs while also increasing subsidy eligibility because these children are out future and it directly related to future success.

I support increasing Head Start eligibility and funding because with early intervention the need for later support is greatly reduced.

I support providing funding to pay for child care for child care employees because this allows them to make a livable wage and supports mental health for employees.

I support shortened time periods for determining subsidy eligibility because the forms and process is stressful and intimidating enough.

I support shortened time periods for child care programs receiving subsidy reimbursement because the programs need the money for day to day functioning and timely reimbursement is necessary for them to operate.
