My name is Donna Lu Holden, and I am a person in long-term recovery from substance use disorder (SUD). I am a resident of Cape Elizabeth. I am writing to you today in support of LD 1714.

My first experience with Portland Recovery Community Center was volunteering about ten years ago. I assisted with telephone recovery support (TRS), which involved making calls to people in recovery to check-in with them to see if they needed any support. This was my first experience volunteering in a recovery setting. I felt needed, and I found a new purpose.

In the last ten years, I have sought various recovery services and treatment options. In November 2021, I found myself back at PRCC at the new location at 102 Bishop Street. Since I have been back, I have had the opportunity to work on my recovery, attend mutual aid meetings, make connections, and volunteer. When I first came back, I felt anxious. Over time, I have felt more comfortable. Today, I feel like I am at my second home.

I have learned so many things since I started coming to PRCC. I became a volunteer recovery coach after taking the training offered at PRRC. I love working with recoverees and supporting them as they work different pathways of recovery. I am planning on starting a new mutual aid group that focuses on women in sobriety and all that that entails.

LD 1714 will help recovery community centers across the state offer a broad variety of services. I hope that this Committee will pass LD 1714.
