Re: LD 1964 — An Act to Implement the Recommendations of the Commission to Develop a Paid Family and Medical Leave Benefits Program

Dear Senator Tipping, Representative Roeder, and members of the committee,

On behalf of the American Council of Life Insurers' and our 317 ACLI member companies licensed to do business in Maine, accounting for 97% of all life and annuity payments, we are neither for nor against LD 1964.

Each day, life insurers pay out \$920 million – \$2.5 million every day – in life insurance and annuity benefits to Maine families. That and other products offered, by our members, protect Maine residents such as retirement savings and personal pensions, long-term care and disability income insurance, supplemental benefits and most importantly, paid family and medical leave which provides income during time off to care for family.

Our members stand ready to offer paid family leave policies in Maine. Many private insurers are well-equipped to provide these important employee benefits as they have the capital, organizational structure, and professional staff with expertise to handle benefits including paid
