My name is Jennifer Waterman and I live in Yarmouth, Maine. I am testifying in support of paid family and medical leave for Maine.

As a small business owner of a private clinical mental health practice, I am not only one of Maine's essential service providers, I also do not get paid if I do not see my clients. When caring for my dying mother recently, I was unable to take the time off I needed to care for her. I could not afford to loose my income...and the care she needed was unavailable from health services. The anguish and pain of this predicament haunts me. The financial costs continue to burden me.

Where our health care systems, including child care and elder care, routinely fail us, we as individuals have been forced to bear the financial and emotional cost of caring for ourselves and our loved ones. This is an impossible task that leaves us with financial crisis and health crisis.

If I had access to Maine State paid family medical leave in the time leading up to my mother's passing, she could have passed with the dignity and care we each deserve. I would have avoided incurring debt, which has been a struggle to pay off.
