This bill, if approved by the legislature and affirmed by the people, would create a formal and permanent role within state government for an official to serve as a conduit of information between the State and the Tribes - in effect, facilitating the long-sought goal of respectful Nation-to-Nation communication, for which our Committee and Tribes both local and national have persistently advocated.

Friends Committee strongly urges "Ought to Pass" and sees this as the next step in bringing our Constitution into the 21st century, making it a document that is truly of, by, and for the people it governs.
