

Written Testimony for the IDEA&B Committee LD 262 An Act to Strengthen Maine's Workforce

Senator Curry, Representative Roberts and members of the Committee. My name is Tony Payne, the Senior Vice President of External Affairs at MEMIC as well as former Chair of the Institute for Civic Leadership, a Maine Development Foundation program.

The state of Maine is in an existential crisis – we are old and getting older. We are losing our workforce while the number of retirees grows at an astounding pace. Elders who are in need of care-giving services are at an even greater risk unlike any time in modern Maine history. We desperately need to replenish the workforce by supporting innovation and collaboration.
