My name is Janis Hogan. I live in Belfast, Maine, and I urge you to vote Ought to Pass on LD 780.

For 47 years, I have worked as a nurse in the state of Maine. Most recently, I was a school nurse for 23 years, having retired in 2022. Working with adolescents and supporting their reproductive choices during one of the most crucial periods in their lives was a privilege. Guiding students to resources to prevent unintended pregnancies was a frequent request. There is nothing more life changing than a teen student becoming pregnant.
