LD 2149, An Act to Exempt Seasonal Volunteer Ski Patrollers and Seasonal Volunteer Ski Ambassadors and Hosts at Ski Areas from the Minimum Wage Laws

Senator Tipping, Representative Roeder, and Members of the Joint Standing Committee on Labor and Housing:

My name is Alison Sucy and I am the Chief Operating Officer and Director of Government Affairs for the Maine Tourism Association. The Maine Tourism Association is the state's largest tourism organization supporting our 1500 members in every type of tourism business such as lodging, restaurants, campgrounds, retail, guides, historical and cultural attractions, and outdoor recreation including ski areas. I present this testimony in support of LD 2149.

There is a long history of volunteerism in the ski industry through ski patrollers in Maine and across the country. These volunteers are critical to the success and safety of Mainers and visitors who ski and snowboard on Maine's mountains. They provide guest safety with on-mountain medical care and transport, chairlift evacuations, and hazard mitigation. We want our visitors to be safe, most importantly, and have a wonderful experience so they will return year after year. Ski ambassadors and patrollers are key to this experience.

Winter tourism is a large contributor to Maine's economy. Nearly 4 million people visited our state in winter of 2023; and 41% of them came primarily for outdoor activities. Some 97% of all winter visitors would recommend Maine as a vacation destination.* The state needs our ski industry to be successful--it contributes 4,090 jobs and \$448 in total economic output.** We want to be known as a safe and welcoming destination.

We respectfully ask that you support LD 2149. Thank you for your time and consideration of this testimony.
