Testimony in Support of LD 2007, An Act to Advance Self-determination for Wabanaki Nations

Sen. Carney, Rep. Moonen and members of the Judiciary Committee, my name is Katherine Rhoda. I reside in Hiram. I'm testifying in support of LD 2007.

I fail to see what public purpose is served by systematically excluding the tribes of Maine from federal legislation affecting each and every other federally recognized tribe. To single out Maine tribes in this way is unfair on the face of it and very burdensome to the tribes. To make an analogy, I'm glad my own town of Hiram doesn't have to lobby to be explicitly included in each piece of State legislation!

To disadvantage the tribes in this way is also to disadvantage their neighboring communities, who stand to benefit from the economic development which will likely follow once access to federal tribal benefits is unlocked.

As the 2022 report on the economic impact of the 1980 Settlement Acts on the Wabanaki Nations and surrounding communities by the Harvard Project on American Indian Economic Development (now the Project on Indigenous Governance and Development) at the Harvard Kennedy School put it: "Subjecting the Wabanaki Nations' capacities to the restrictions of MISCA [the Maine Indian Claims Settlement Act] stifles substantial development opportunities – to the detriment of both the Wabanaki and non-Wabanaki citizens of Maine. The unrealized opportunities measure in the hundreds of millions of dollars of GDP for the state, representing support for thousands of jobs held by Mainers and tens of millions of dollars going into Maine's tribal, state, and local treasuries."

That said, the situation of the Maine tribes is much more than an economic issue. It's a moral one, a matter of justice. It is simply wrong to deny them the opportunities for self-determination that every other federally recognized tribe in the country enjoys. You have a golden opportunity to help correct the situation. Please do the right thing and support LD 2007.
