The indigenous tribes of Maine deserve the same recognition the other 570 federal tribes in the United States receieve. Indigenous nations, and indeed the Wabanaki Nation, have an inherent right to self-determination and Maine laws need to catch up.

Mainers are becoming more and more aware that we are indeed on native land and we must do more than just acknowledge this truth. We must stand for native sovereignty.

Thank you for your time. I have faith things are changing for the better for Wabanaki citizens, and all of Maine will be better for it.
