It feels shameful to know that the State of Maine, unlike many other states, stands out as an oppressor of the our native Wabenaki people.

You have the power AND the support of many fair-minded Mainers across the state to make important changes by lifting the restrictions imposed by the 1980 Maine Indian Claims Settlement Act (MICSA).
