Sen. Carney, Rep. Moonen and members of the Judiciary Committee, my name is Emily Weyrauch and I live in Buxton. I am testifying on behalf of Resource Generation Maine in support of LD 2007.

Our group, the Maine chapter of Resource Generation, consists of young people with wealth and/or class privilege who are committed to the equitable distribution of wealth, land, and power.

An important part of Resource Generation Maine's shared values is a clear understanding of our connections to land and wealth that was stolen, and working to right those historical wrongs. We know that Wabanaki people were stewarding the land and maintaining sustainable ecological practices for millennia, long before the European seizure and settlement of what we now call "Maine"--and that justice looks like the immediate step of restoring Wabanaki sovereignty, and a long road ahead of repairing relationships and re-establishing access to culturally important land and practices.

Wabanaki tribes have inherent sovereignty, but their current status outlined in the Maine Indian Claims Settlement Act prevents them from taking full advantage of federal self-determination policies—to which all 570 other federally recognized tribes have access. This has hindered the economic well-being of Wabanaki people—an insult to the intergenerational damage of land theft, systemic violence, and forced family separation that mark a shameful stain on our state's history. And this has left the Wabanaki tribes without the resources and access available to every other federally recognized tribe in the US. We must act immediately to restore Wabanaki inherent rights to self-determination.

As Resource Generation Maine, we are a group of people who believe that our personal well-being is deeply tied to the well-being of all of those in our communities. We know that when the Wabanaki thrive, we all thrive. Passing this bill will help the Wabanaki tribes access federal opportunities to expand environmental protections, increase access to health care, respond to natural disasters, foster job creation and economic development, protect safe drinking water, and much more. When Wabanaki communities experience prosperity and well-being, we all experience greater security and well-being. Our communities will become stronger—and more climate resilient, prosperous, and healthy. It's a future that we can feel hopeful about.
