spaces and resources which the Wabanaki people have stewarded for many thousands of years,

long before anyone uttered the term "Vacationland"; this state which maintains the motto

"Dirigo". Nothing can erase or undo the horrific injustices perpetrated on native people

throughout the duration of this nation's development, but we have the opportunity today to make

a better choice. Passing LD 2007 is a small step in the right direction. Allowing this bill to fail

would be yet another senseless, harmful act against the Wabanaki people. LD 2007 merely

brings the rights of the Wabanaki Nations in line with the other 570 federally recognized tribes in

the United States.

legislation. Please vote in favor of this Act to Advance Self-determination for Wabanaki

Nations.
