Testimony in support of LD 2007, An Act to Advance Self-determination for
Wabanaki Nations

Dear Senator Carney, Representative Moonen, and members of the Judiciary
Committee, my name is Brahn Smith and I live in Connor Township. I am an
illustrator and photographer who loves Maine's nature and endearing spirit. I am
writing to testify in support of LD 2007.

The federal government has long since recognized that tribes can and should be
allowed to self govern, and I see no reason why Maine should not follow these federal
laws. But most importantly, I see every reason that self governing is deeply owed to
the people of the Wabanaki Nations. They are their own people, and always have
been. They have their own beliefs, rules, culture, etc. We should have never taken
over the governing role of their people to begin with, and we can not continue this
way. This is a holdover of old, incorrect, and morally repugnant colonization
behaviors. The fact that the Settlement Act made it a process of buying back their
own land, alone, is grossly inappropriate. But the fact that it was made with major
oversight and confining terms of white settlers over the Wabanaki Nations is morally
wrong, and should be considered legally incorrect.

Additionally, the delay in protections and federal laws made to benefit all tribes here
in America is horrific and clearly detrimental to the Wabanaki Nations. They deserve
to benefit from the passing of these laws, just as anyone in America should.

I thank the committee members for their time and consideration in this complex but
serious matter. I believe we owe much more than this to the Wabanaki Nations, and
we long past due to get started on giving back to them what is rightfully theirs. Giving
them self governance is a very good first step, and will help them proceed as the
intelligent and able nation that they are.
