I am ashamed to say that some, maybe many, of the descendants of John and Elizabeth, and others who immigrated from England and the rest of Europe repaid this kindness with greed and murder. The details of this history are chilling, nauseating, hard to read.

LD2007 is an important opportunity, an opportunity for both social justice and economic growth, an opportunity to support a more positive relationship between the State of Maine and the Nations who preceded European immigrants. It will allow the Wabanaki to govern themselves. It will support economic growth for the Wabanaki, which will benefit our entire state, through the creation of jobs and taxable revenues.
