I believe this bill is a good idea because too many accidental deaths are caused by guns getting into the wrong hands through inadequate safety procedures in the home, lack of a waiting period and failure to have educational materials about responsible gun ownership available to the public at gun shops. And there is a great need for mobile mental health facilities to respond to specific mental health and specific crisis techniques to be built into existing crisis intervention services. This bill is comprehensive and needs to be adequately funded.

Please help Maine communities to respond to increasing need by Establishing an Office of Violence Prevention within the Maine Centers for Disease Control to coordinate and educate the public and fund all the specific coordinating agencies specified within this bill.

I have spent a career in youth development increasing safe and fun opportunities for youth to grow into responsible adults who continue contributing to the benefit of community throughout their lives.

I remember the shock, astonishment and fear on the afternoon we learned about the shootings at Columbine School and nearly immediately went into a professional development session to search for resources and techniques to help young people and families address and cope with the horror. How did we become a society where a similar terror, suicide, or accident by gun happens somewhere to someone's lives even here in Maine?

This bill will help everyone by increasing safety so a few don't ruin their own lives and the lives of others by accident, mental crisis, or lack of education; it takes a whole-of-government approach to address gun safety.
