This entails bolstering mental health services, tackling socioeconomic disparities, and enhancing enforcement of existing laws to prevent firearms from falling into the wrong hands.

In light of these compelling arguments, I implore the Maine Judicial Committee to reject the proposed mandatory waiting period for firearm purchases. Upholding our constitutional rights and preserving individual freedoms must remain paramount, particularly in the face of ill-conceived legislative overreach.
