"We are ready to take a bullet for your child". This was the response I got from the director of my daughter's preschool as I asked about active shooting protocols in the wake of Uvalde. We need to value life by having laws that reflect this.

I was right around 8 weeks pregnant with my daughter when the Parkland shooting happened not too far from where I was living at the time. I implore you to place greater value on the lives of our children than guns. Please pass common sense gun laws that protect Mainers so our state does not have another Lewiston shooting. We know the devastation that a mass shooting causes. If we let that happen again how can we look our children in the eyes and tell them we did absolutely everything in our power to keep them safe. Please remember your constituents and their children when you legislate because no parent wants to lose a child to gun violence.
