**LD 2283 -** An Act to Enact the Crisis Intervention Order Act to Protect the Safety of the Public

April 5, 2024

Respected Members of the Judiciary Committees, my name is Gia Drew. I am the Executive Director of EqualityMaine, which has been representing and advocating for Maine's LGBTQ+ community since 1984, and I am testifying today on behalf of EqualityMaine in support of **LD 2283.** We strongly believe that there is no single solution to stopping gun violence in Maine, which has the highest gun death rate in New England, and that a comprehensive approach including a true extreme risk protection order is long overdue.

It is vital to note that serious mental illness is not by itself a predictor of violence. Only 3-5% of violence is committed by people with mental health disabilities and less than 5% of gun-related deaths in the U.S. are committed by people with mental health disabilities. In fact, people with severe mental illnesses are over 10 times more likely to be victims of a violent crime than the general population.<sup>1</sup>

LGBTQ+ people are more than two times as likely to be victims of gun violence than their straight and cisgender peers.<sup>2</sup> Since 2013, nearly two-thirds of fatal violence toward transgender and gender-nonconforming people involved a gun; the majority of those victims were black women under the age of 30.<sup>3</sup> The LGBTQ+ community is also disproportionately impacted by suicide, in no small part due to the stigma, discrimination, and bias that are on the rise around the country. The combination of a lack of adequate laws to prevent gun violence and animosity towards the LGBTQ+ community had led to the loss of lives as well as immense harm and trauma caused by violence.
