Dear Senator Margaret Rotundo, Chair Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs and Representative Drew Gatine, Chair Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs:

I am writing to express Heart of Biddeford's strong support for the Maine Development Foundation (MDF) and its Maine Downtown Center (MDC) program. The impact of MDF/MDC is evident across our state, and its work has been instrumental in the revitalization and ongoing success of Biddeford's downtown and mill district.

A striking example of the effectiveness of this network occurred this past year when the Maine Downtown Center conference was held in Biddeford. During lunchtime, 160 conference participants were set to eat at 16 different downtown restaurants. However, just before noon, a local construction incident struck a transformer, cutting power to all of these businesses. Despite this unexpected challenge, the response was immediate and seamless. The Maine Downtown Center, along with hosts from Heart of Biddeford and Saco Main Street, sprang into action, contacting each restaurant to determine who could continue serving with cold foods. Within 80 minutes, all participants were successfully fed, and the conference continued without missing a beat.

While this may seem like a story about one unique incident, it is, in fact, a metaphor for the essential role of the MDF/MDC. It highlights what is possible when a small, dedicated group of individuals—skilled in communication, adaptability, and collaboration—comes together to problem-solve and sustain momentum toward shared goals. These skills are precisely what the Maine Development Foundation cultivates through its programs, and they are more necessary than ever in a time of economic uncertainty, social divisions, and environmental challenges.

Heart of Biddeford's mission is to foster a vibrant, inclusive, and sustainable downtown, and the Maine Downtown Center has played a vital role in supporting this mission. The Main Street program provides communities with the tools and training necessary to sustain and grow, and Biddeford's ongoing revitalization is a testament to the power of this work. Since we were awarded the Great American Main Street Award in 2022, our city has become a national model for downtown redevelopment, attracting visitors and inquiries from across the country about how we've achieved this success. The foundation of this transformation can be traced back to the support, guidance, and strategies provided by MDF/MDC.

This past year, Heart of Biddeford applied for a \$20 million EPA grant in collaboration with the University of New England. This rigorous five-month process was a major undertaking, and while we were not among the 4% of applicants selected, the experience built invaluable skills and partnerships that will serve us in future opportunities. The confidence and expertise to take on such a challenge can be directly attributed to the training and leadership we have received from the Maine Downtown Center.

The work of MDF/MDC goes far beyond one community—it is a statewide force for economic and community development. It has helped foster entrepreneurship, attract

investment, and create thriving downtowns that serve as economic and cultural hubs for our state. Without their guidance, many of Maine's historic downtowns would struggle to define and sustain themselves. Instead, under their leadership, communities are flourishing.

We urge you to fund the MDF/MDC request in full, and consider adding to it to reflect the increased needs of our state. The return on investment for their work is exponential, and their continued support is critical to sustaining Maine's economic vitality. Please do not hesitate to reach out with any questions.
