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## LD 178 An Act Regarding Coverage for Step Therapy for Advanced Metastatic Cancer

Good morning, Senator Donna Bailey and Representative Kristi Mathieson and the esteemed members of the Committee on Health Coverage, Insurance and Financial Services. I am Meredith Strang Burgess, a former member and Chair of the Health and Human Services Committee in the 123<sup>rd</sup>, 124<sup>th</sup> and 125<sup>th</sup> Legislature representing the towns of Cumberland, Part of North Yarmouth, Chebeague and Long Island.
