The Commissioner of Environmental Protection and the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife must recommend more <u>stringent watercraft inspection</u> protocols on inland waters of the State known to be infested with invasive aquatic plants. They must review surface use restrictions and practice due diligence in <u>clearly notifying the public</u> of those restrictions.
