A low minimum salary makes it difficult to attract and retain talented educators. Across the state, we see vacancies left unfilled, increasing the burden on already

We cannot expect our schools to provide the quality education our students deserve if we do not pay teachers a livable wage.

Increasing the minimum teacher salary is a necessary step to ensure that Maine remains competitive in recruiting and retaining dedicated professionals in education. This investment will not only strengthen the teaching profession but also directly benefit our students, who thrive under the guidance of experienced, supported educators.
