LD 283 could put at risk the critical funding used to promote Maine tourism and attract visitors.

- The bill functions as a local option sales tax and establishes a new revenue-sharing model that could easily lead to future increases in meals and lodging taxes.
- Tourism in Maine dropped 9% in summer 2024 (Maine Office of Tourism). Now is not the time to weaken the funding that helps bring visitors here.
- In 2023, tourists spent more than \$9 billion, with Maine's tourism industry generating an overall economic impact of \$16 billion annually.
