The Maine Town & City Clerks' Association supports LD 83 and we thank you for the opportunity to outline our points for your Committee.

Members had no concerns about requiring that marriage intentions be scanned and attached in the vital records system. Clerks felt that allowing the parties of the marriage to file the marriage license after the ceremony is reasonable.

Clerks were strongly in support of the repeal of the requirement to provide a brochure to every couple filing marriage intentions, detailing the effects of alcohol and drugs on a fetus, since many marriages are for people of the same sex, beyond child-bearing years, unable to bear children due to medical issues or is not the first marriage.
