Well needless to say, we remained childless until after he got his degree. Little did I know at the time that schools would deny you a teaching job if you were pregnant, which is what happened in two years when we were back in Michigan. The federal law regarding not discriminating against a person because of gender wasn't passed for another seven years. I lost my teaching job in the middle of the year in that Michigan high school. Talk about a shock!
