My name is Kim Michel, I'm a resident of Waldoboro, and I appreciate the opportunity to address the Committee. I am testifying in support of LD 260, the Maine Inclusive Equal Rights Amendment bill. Though Maine currently has the Maine Human Rights Act as law to prevent and address discrimination, equal rights should be codified more firmly for all people in the State Constitution by passing LD 260. Having equal rights explicitly guaranteed in the Maine Constitution would be a more robust step in guaranteeing equal protection under the law for people in all protected classes, as 29 other states in the U.S. have already done.
