Thank you for the opportunity to address the committee. My name is Emily Pines. I'm a resident of Portland Maine and I am a parent as well as a Licensed therapist working with children and adolescents. I am writing this testimony on behalf of myself only.

I have worked for the past 10 plus years in Maine and within the educational system providing therapeutic support to youth. I have seen how lack of protection for discrimination impacts children and adolescents and can create a domino effect in impacting negatively their success in educational endeavors.

This bill has the ability to ensure that even if state statutes or laws change, equal rights for all are still protected in Maine's constitution. This bill is critical right now as our public discourse is veering toward animosity and anger toward LGBTQ plus and transgender communities, many of whom are vulnerable students, who may not have the privilege to come before this committee to share their experiences and request to be safely educated and protected as they do so. As a society and a state, we worry about youth mental health and understand that when youth are experiencing trauma, this impacts their ability to focus and learn. When their basic civil rights are not being addressed, this can certainly create trauma
