Dear members of the Health and Human Services Committee,
I write to you as a concerned parent and taxpayer regarding a recent proposal to cut a significant amount of money from the Child Care Salary Supplement Program budget. Please do the right thing tomorrow and vote NO to proposed cuts.

My daughter, age 3, is enrolled in a nonprofit childcare center located on Peaks Island (the Peaks Island Children's Workshop). "The Workshop" is a critical piece of infrastructure that allows working families to continue to live on Peaks Island.

As someone who was raised on the island, I have seen the island demographic change drastically over the years, including many wealthy individuals who don't have a stake in increasing childcare costs. As Maine has gotten "discovered" over the last several years, I think this is a trend that is happening across the state.

The budget cuts proposed by this legislation not only endanger Peaks Island, but all of Maine. Just as Peaks Island has become a refuge for those looking for tranquility and a unique way of life, so has the rest of our state.
