Preserving the largest undeveloped, uninhabited, causeway-accessible island on the eastern coast of the United States is a once in a lifetime opportunity and a gift to the future people of Maine which will preserve something which is irreplicable. Let's keep the treasure we have and finally permanently protect it in its entirety - and if we need a new port, instead invest in facilities that already exist rather than destroying something irreplaceable.
