This bill would create the new position of bail officer. In essence it would professionalize the setting of bail by having an individual whose sole job is to set and review bail. This should minimize errors, minimize the amount of time people are incarcerated, and ensure that appropriate bail and bail conditions are set.

The bail officer would be required to undergo mandatory training and therefore they would be in a better position to make appropriate decisions regarding bail. The bail process would be fully remote which would remove the \$60 bail commissioner fee which is often onerous to indigent defendants. A \$60 bail commissioner fee is due when a bail commissioner shows up at a jail to set bail.

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Additionally, the bill would allow for law enforcement and or corrections officers to fill out bail bonds according to the specifications set by the bail officer. This should help expedite the processing and releasing of Defendants.

This bill should be voted Ought to Pass.
