One of the major concerns with hearing aids is that they are not affordable. Eyeglasses for folks with bad eye vision have an easier time to access the tools they need to see better, but the deaf and HOH community face barriers to obtain hearing aids.

A few months ago, I decided to get an updated hearing test at Hearing Life in South Portland and I failed the hearing test miserably, which is expected. When I asked the doctor about possibly purchasing hearing aids, he told me about how insurance companies see hearing aids as a "Cosmetic" or "Implants", which I think is crazy since I just want to hear my co-workers at work, not get on a reality show like the Real Housewives of Cape Elizabeth, but anyway, Maine does have some barriers to get hearing aids and I think this bill will help many people living with hearing loss including myself.
