Testimony of Laura Mitchell, Executive Director, Maine Affordable Housing Coalition, 3.18.25

in favor of LD698 – An Act to Sustain Emergency Homeless Shelters in Maine. Sponsored by SenatorTalbot Ross

Hello, Senator Curry, Representative Gere, and Members of the Joint Standing Committee on Housing and Economic Development.

My name is Laura Mitchell. I am the Executive Director of the Maine Affordable Housing Coalition. MAHC is a nonprofit with 140 member organizations working to create and preserve affordable homes in our state.

MAHC is in favor of LD698 that will provide a minimal increase in the funding for emergency shelters to meet inflation and cost increases since the funding was capped in 2016.

According to MaineHousing, in 2016 when the state's nightly Shelter Operating subsidy for was set at \$7 per bed night, there were 1,200 Maine people experiencing homelessness. Last year, there were 2,700 people in need of shelter. Emergency shelters are struggling to meet these growing needs, let alone stay open on the State's flat operating funding over the last 8 years.

MaineHousing reports that a shelter bed in Maine costs \$102 a night to operate. Maine's emergency shelters have faced rising costs from inflation and had to expand services to keep communities safe. LD 698 will right size the State's Shelter Operating subsidy to \$18 a bed per night, helping to ensure Maine's emergency shelters remain open.

While nobody grows up planning to stay in a homeless shelter, shelters are a necessary part of the housing continuum when people face employment, medical, and other emergencies that leave them without a place to call home.

The rising cost of rents and homeownership compared with wages in Maine is leaving more and more people vulnerable to experiencing homelessness. While the Maine Affordable Housing Coalition knows building and preserving affordable housing is the solution to many of Maine's challenges, the coalition also recognizes that emergency shelters are a vital link in getting people into homes.

We ask you to support LD698 to keep Maine's emergency shelters open as we work to address Maine's long term housing production goals. The alternative is more costly emergency room, jail, and medical interventions that the State will be responsible for.

Thank you for considering this investment in maintaining access to vital emergency housing in Maine.
