Testimony of the Maine Service Centers Coalition LD 747, An Act to Provide Funds to Reduce Student Homelessness

Senator Curry, Representative Gere and esteemed members of the Joint Standing Committee on Housing and Economic Development, the Maine Service Centers Coalition is submitting testimony in support of LD 747, An Act to Provide Funds to Reduce Student Homelessness.

The Maine Service Centers Coalition, comprised of 26 towns and cities across the state, articulates the importance of healthy and thriving service center communities, advocates for public policy that supports and contributes to the economic and social viability of our communities, and collaborates with municipal officials, legislators, state agencies and nonprofits to pursue quality of life for all who live and work in our state.

As you well know, homelessness continues to be a serious issue across our state. Our service center communities are acutely aware of its impact with so many individuals and families turning to our cities and towns in search of housing. We are especially concerned about the growing number of students in our schools who are experiencing homelessness.

Young people are Maine's greatest asset. It is up to all of us to provide them with the best education possible so they have the opportunity to become thriving members of our communities and our state. Sadly, for more and more young people, their ability to learn is being impeded by their lack of basic shelter.

LD 747 would allocate \$2 million in both years of the next biennium to the Maine State Housing Authority to "provide rental assistance directly to homeless students or to an adult family member or guardian of the homeless student." Access to these funds would offer housing stability to many of the unhoused students we are seeing in our schools, giving them the security to focus on their studies rather than where they will be sleeping at night. The impacts would be significant and long lasting for our students whose lives have been upended by homelessness.

Please give every consideration to supporting LD 747. It is a worthwhile investment in Maine's young people as well as in the future of our state.
