There are currently no health protections or evaluations in Maine's existing Metallic Mineral Mining law. Passing LD 1073 would provide a baseline health assessment for mining communities prior to any mining operations and establish required monitoring of potentially harmful toxic waste after mining closures.

No health or economic burden should be left upon vulnerable Maine communities after mining operations have been terminated. It's only fair for all communities to be informed and establish a universal understanding of the potential risks of exposure to toxic materials from mining operations, and supporting LD 1073 is a step towards fulfilling this.
