I oppose this bill. Additionally, the bill may lead to unnecessary legal penalties for law-abiding citizens who may unknowingly possess parts that could be interpreted as "machine gun" components under the new, broader definition. Critics argue that the bill imposes undue restrictions on responsible firearm owners and may create an overreach in the regulation of legally owned firearms and parts.
