# **Subject:** S.P. 297/LD 682 Harms Mainers—Withdraw This Dangerous Bill

Dear Senator Haggan, Representative Smith, and Cosponsors (Senators Bernard, Guerin, Harrington; Representatives Carlow, Griffin, Haggan, Paul, Quint):

I am writing in vehement opposition to **S.P. 297/LD 682**, which would impose intrusive reporting requirements on abortion patients, restrict life-saving care after viability, and reinstate criminal penalties for healthcare providers. This bill is a blatant violation of medical privacy, constitutional rights, and the well-being of your constituents. Here's how it will harm Mainers:

## 1. It Violates Medical Privacy

- Section 1 forces patients to disclose race, marital status, and education level to the state—data easily weaponized to target vulnerable communities (e.g., women of color, low-income Mainers).
  - Example: A domestic violence survivor's marital status could be used to identify her if data is leaked.
  - Source: Maine ACLU warns this mirrors tactics used in anti-abortion states to harass patients (2024 Report).

## 2. It Bans Life-Saving Abortions

- **Section 3** replaces physician judgment with vague "medical necessity" standards for post-viability abortions, endangering patients with:
  - Severe fetal anomalies (e.g., anencephaly) that cause excruciating short-term suffering but don't meet the arbitrary "3-month death" rule.
  - Emergent health risks (e.g., preeclampsia at 24 weeks), where delays for legal review could be fatal.
  - Source: Maine Medical Association states this will "tie doctors' hands during emergencies" (March 2025 letter).

#### 3. It Criminalizes Healthcare Providers

• Sections 5–6 reinstate Class C/D felonies for providers, including:

- Nurse practitioners performing early abortions (currently legal under Maine law).
- Physicians acting to save a patient's life if the state later disputes "necessity."
- Impact: Rural areas like Aroostook County (Sen. Bernard's district) already face OB-GYN shortages. This will worsen the crisis.

### **District-Specific Harms**

- Sen. Haggan (Penobscot): Northern Light Health in Bangor handles 85% of post-viability cases in your district. This bill will force them to turn away patients or risk prosecution.
- Rep. Paul (Winterport): Your Waldo County constituents have no labor/delivery hospitals. Delays in care will mean more preventable deaths.
- **Rep. Griffin (Levant)**: After cosponsoring **HP 635's total ban**, this is another attack on your district's 1,200+ MaineCare patients needing reproductive care (*Maine DHHS*, 2024).

## **Demand for Accountability**

Cite one constitutional scholar who believes forcing patients to disclose marital status to the state is legal. Name one medical group that supports jailing doctors for post-viability abortions. If you cannot, withdraw this bill immediately.
