In Opposition to LD 1049 An Act to Eliminate the Duty to Inform a Law Enforcement Officer When Carrying a Concealed Handgun Without a Permit

This is a difficult bill for me because when the original bill for Concealed Carry without a permit was passed, it was a very difficult decision for me and several others. You know when you ask a legislator if there was ever a bill that you wish you hadn't supported, this is the one for me. With permits, at least our law enforcement have knowledge of where they are. Don't get me wrong I am sure in today's world our law enforcement officers assume they have one but does an individual carrying a concealed handgun know that? A simple statement from one of my posters stated: "With or without a permit...
