Thank you for the opportunity to address the committee. My name is Alisha Heal and I am a resident of Kennebunk Maine, clinical social worker, parent and concerned citizen. I am offering written testimony in support of LD 677. Gun ownership and gun safety are not mutually exclusive concepts; laws allowing Mainer's to exercise their 2nd amendment right can exist side by side with gun sense laws that disarm hate.
