Senator Grohoski, Representative Cloutier, and members of the Taxation Committee, my name is Sidney Pew and I live in Andover. I am submitting testimony in support of LD 1047: An Act to Impose an Additional Tax on Certain Unearned Income" and LD 1089: "An Act to Permanently Fund 55 Percent of the State's Share of Education by Establishing a Tax on Incomes of More than \$1,000,000".

My entire life, I have consistently stated that we should have more fairness when it comes to taxation in this country. The fact that millionaires utilize the same tax code as someone earning over \$61,600 annually is ridiculous. By implementing a higher tax as proposed in LD 1047 it would only apply to the richest people.
